PHASING OUT OF DIESEL 500 PPM

The Botswana Energy Regulatory Authority (BERA) would like to inform the general public that Diesel 500 ppm will be phased out of the Botswana market with effect from 1st January 2021. Diesel 50 ppm will continue to be available in the market throughout the country. The Authority is working collaboratively with the local oil industry and the Ministry of Mineral Resources, Green Technology and Energy Security to ensure that the transition is implemented smoothly.

The phasing out of high sulphur diesel 500 ppm is in line with the government's commitment to promote the use of cleaner fuels and global initiatives to reduce carbon emissions. There is an increasing demand for the use of low sulphur diesel due to newer vehicle models available in the market. The use of cleaner fuels will support the introduction of advanced engine technology that requires low sulphur content diesel, enhance preservation of the environment and care for public health.
